Another extremely well attended event was the Holocaust Remembrance Program that took place on August 27 at the Lake Worth Scottish Rite. We had over 140 people in attendance and it was literally standing-room-only in the mural room where we held the program. I was so pleased to see so many of my Brothers from Jupiter Light Lodge present and I am sure that you all found the program as moving as I did. Maureen Carter, Program Planner for Holocaust Studies at the School District of Palm Beach County, gave a very interesting program on how Freemasons were impacted by the Holocaust. This was followed by a testimonial by This was followed by a powerful personal testimonial by Worshipful Raoul Tommasi Crudeli, a Past Master from Florence, Italy, who has been attending our Lodge recently, and whose parents perished in the Holocaust. The Royal Palm Beach High School Chorus sang three songs in Yiddish, and the keynote speaker, Holocaust Survivor Norman Frajman, held the audience spellbound as he spoke about his experiences. It was a very profound and emotionally charged evening which had a great impact on everyone present.

Robert Kennedy once wrote, *“Each time a person stands up for an ideal, or acts to improve the lot of others, or strikes out against injustice, he sends forth a tiny ripple of hope, and crossing each other from a million different centers of energy and daring, these ripples build a current that can sweep down the mightiest walls of oppression and resistance.”* As Masons, this is a principle that we embrace and act upon frequently, and it causes me to reflect upon the importance of being a beckon of hope in a world that sometimes holds a lot of darkness. Whether it be letting our voices be heard in standing up to tyranny and injustice and making sure the events of the past are not forgotten, devoting our financial and physical resources to help support organizations such as the Hope Center for Autism and Quantum House, offering an active duty member of our armed forces the opportunity
